The Dental Hygiene Clinic is located in Health Technologies Hall on the Toledo-area Campus. Just five minutes from downtown Toledo, the campus is easy to find. Take I-75 to exit 198 (Wales Road exit) Turn right on Oregon Road and go south about a mile. The five-story Health Technologies Hall is on the right and is marked by the O on top.

The Dental Hygiene Clinic

The Dental Hygiene program at Owens Community College's Toledo-area Campus operates a Dental Hygiene Clinic September through May. The 20-chair clinic, open to adults and children, is staffed by dental hygiene students supervised by licensed dental professionals.

Owens Community College dental hygiene students participating in the clinic have had extensive education prior to their clinical experience. The Dental Hygiene Clinic provides an opportunity for members of our community to receive safe, quality dental services at a reasonable cost.

Preventive Dental Services

Owens dental hygiene students are prepared to offer a variety of preventive dental services:

- Oral assessments
- Radiographs (X-rays)
- Home dental care and diet instruction
- Dental cleanings
- Pit and fissure sealants
- Inspection and cleaning of dentures

Restorative Dental Services

Other services performed in the Dental Hygiene Clinic include limited restorative procedures for selected clients. Restorative procedures include silver and tooth-colored fillings. Restorative services provided by Owens students are supervised by licensed personnel.

Radiographs (X-rays) and results of oral examinations may be referred to a patient's dentist. The services provided at the Dental Hygiene Clinic are not intended to replace regular or extensive dental care.

Client Responsibilities

If you need to cancel an appointment, please notify the Dental Hygiene Clinic at least 24 hours in advance. Dental hygiene students at Owens must complete their clinical requirements during a set time period. Excessive cancellations by patients may reduce opportunities for further services at the Dental Hygiene Clinic.

Payment for Services

Minimal fees are charged to clients to cover the expense of supplies used during treatment. Fees are paid at the first appointment before treatment begins. Only cash transactions are accepted. Medicaid reimbursement is accepted.

Appointment Information

Generally, preventive treatment appointments are two to three hours in length and require several visits. Restorative treatment appointments vary depending on the amount of work necessary. The average restorative appointment is two to four hours long.
