PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The mission of the Dental Assisting Program is to provide a scientifically current; competency-based curriculum focusing on intellectual, psychomotor, and affective education essential to become a competent Dental Assistant. The students are instructed in dental assisting by highly qualified faculty to meet today's changing oral health care needs.

ADMISSION

Admission is limited and selective. Students must maintain a 2.0 average or better to progress in the Dental Assisting. Students who do not maintain this average or receive less than 70% in a Dental Assisting Course will not remain in the program. Students must obtain a "C" or better.

READMISSION

Students may be readmitted one time only on a space available basis.

DENTAL ASSISTANT WORK ENVIRONMENT

The dental assisting healthcare worker provides services in an environment that includes blood and saliva. Diseases may be encountered in this type of environment; however, research shows that risks are negligible when appropriate infection control procedures/barrier techniques are used. Upon entering the program, there is in-depth training to meet the protocol for a hazard-free, safe learning environment.

Students enrolled in the Dental Assisting Certificate are required to take the Certified Ohio Dental Assistant Examination given in Columbus. This is held at the Ohio Business College offered twice a year in May and October. This exam is given on the weekend.

ACADEMICS

Students are graded on more than lecture materials. They are accountable for ethical and professional behavior and must demonstrate a desire and capability to provide quality dental care to clients.

Critical thinking is essential in a health care environment and information will be acquired and synthesized by the student and not only presented in a rote manner.

All program materials will not be presented in class time or lecture. Students are responsible for guided independent study. Also for reading and understanding all program manuals and syllabi.

To progress in the program the student must come to class prepared by reading assignments. It is estimated that for each course credit hour the student must do 3-4 hours of study each evening with approximately 8 hours on the weekends.

Students will be in class, lab or clinic approximately 16-18 hours a week, depending on the semester.

There will be required activities outside of courses in the curriculum such as; orientations, professional activities and the Student American Dental Assisting Association, Student Chapter.

The Dental Assisting Program is academically, clinically, and personally challenging. The compensation will come in the feeling of confidence and achievement you reach at the end of the certificate. At that time, you will have the privilege of entering the Dental Assistant Profession and all of the rewards associated with it.

Reference list for Health Requirements To be Submitted to Certified Background

Requirement	What is needed	Additional information
Measles (Rubeola)	 After history of two vaccinations: Submit a positive antibody titer for Measles (Rubeola). (lab report required) 	If not positive, get another booster After the booster is up loaded, no further action required.
Mumps	 After history of two vaccinations: Submit a positive antibody titer for Mumps. (lab report required) 	If not positive, get another booster After the booster is up loaded, no further action required.
Rubella	 After history of two vaccinations: Submit a positive antibody titer for Rubella (lab report required) 	If not positive, get another booster. - After the booster is up loaded, no further action required.
Varicella (Chicken Pox)	 After history of two vaccinations: Submit a positive antibody titer. (lab report required) 	If not positive, get another booster After the booster is up loaded, no further action required.
Hepatitis B	Prior to start of the three shot series have blood drawn for a Hepatitis ANTIGEN (negative lab result required) After the Antigen is drawn, start the series: Vaccination #1 Vaccination #2 done 1 month after #1 Vaccination #3 done 5 months after #2 After #3 wait 3 months and have blood drawn for a Hepatitis ANTIBODY titer. Positive result required. (lab report required)	If, after the three shot series, your antibody does not show immunity, you need one more Booster (you do not need to repeat the series unless your health provider directs you to do so). - After the booster is up loaded, no further action required.
Hepatitis Declination	If you decline to get the Hepatitis series, you must: • Have blood drawn for a Hepatitis Antigen. (negative result required) AND • Have a signed declination waiver on file.	This is an annual requirement.

Before Placing Your Order

Required Personal Information

• In addition to entering your full name and date of birth, you will be asked for your Social Security Number, current address, phone number and Owens e-mail address.

> Immunizations

Document trackers provide secure online storage for all of your important documents. At
the end of the online order process you will be prompted to upload specific documents
required by your school for immunization, medical or certification records.

> Payment Information

• During the online order process you will be prompted to enter your Personal Identification Number (PIN), which is your Student OCID.

Place Your Order

Go to: www.CertifiedBackground.com and enter package code: You will then be directed to set up your **CertifiedProfile** account.

View Your Results

Your results will be posted directly to your CertifiedProfile account. You will be notified if there is any missing information needed in order to process your order. Immunization Tracker Requirements

Measles (Rubeola)

-Submit a positive antibody titer (lab report required) for Measles (Rubeola).

Mumps

-Submit a positive antibody titer (lab report required) for Mumps.

Rubella

-Submit a positive antibody titer (lab report required) for Rubella.

Varicella (Chicken Pox)

-Submit a positive antibody titer (lab report required).

Hepatitis B

-There must be documentation of one of the following:

Positive Hepatitis B Surface Antibody titer (lab report required)

Negative Hepatitis B Surface Antigen titer AND 3 vaccines

Declination waiver AND a negative Hepatitis B Surface Antigen titer within the past year

TB Skin Test

-There must be documentation of one of the following:

2 step TB Skin test (1-3 weeks apart) with yearly PPD's after

If positive results, provide a clear Chest X-Ray (lab report OR physician verification of results required)

Tetanus

-There must be documentation of a Tetanus OR Tdap booster within the past 10 years.

CPR Certification

-There must be documentation of one of the following:

American Heart Association Healthcare Provider course

American Red Cross Professional Rescuers course

-Copy must be front and back of the card & card must be signed. Certificates OR letters from provider are accepted temporarily until card arrives.

Influenza

-Submit documentation of a flu shot administered during the current flu season.

Physical Examination

-Download, print & complete the Physical Examination form and upload to this requirement. Physical Exam must be completed on school form AND signed by a medical professional.
